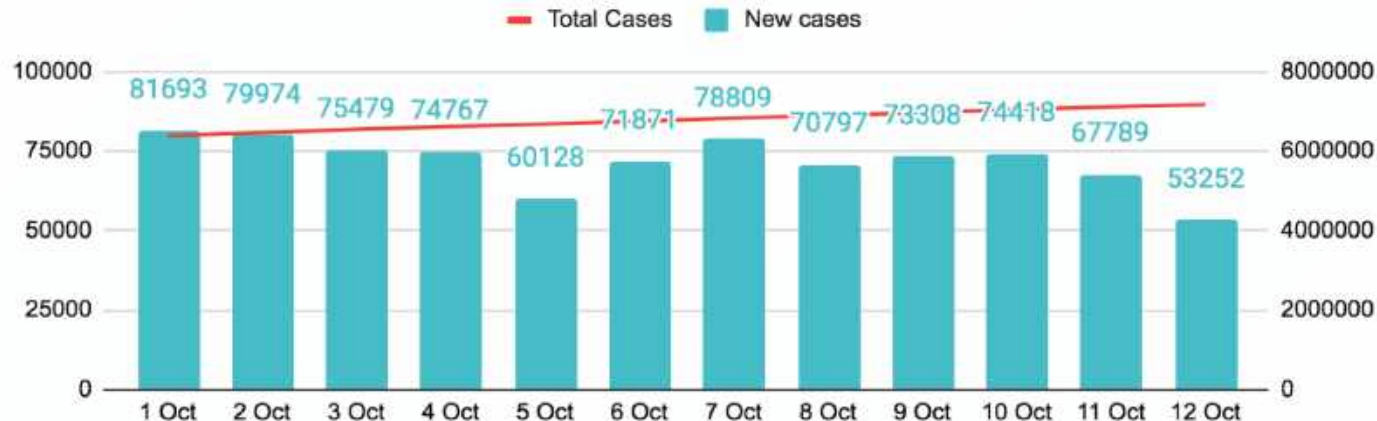

India Caseload Trend



Punjab was the first State in the Country to impose a curfew, even before the National Lockdown. Since then, the State Government has taken several measures to manage the pandemic and its implications.

Punjab has set up a **State COVID-19 Management Group** to review the situation and send their report to the Chief Minister. **13 Committees** have been set up to report to the group:

SOME IMPORTANT DECISIONS

1

Free Walk-in testing has been allowed in all government and private labs from **September 2020**. Rates for RT PCR, RAT and TruNat testing have been notified for private facilities.

2

Mobile Medical Units with testing facilities have been operationalised in 12 districts

3

Restrictions due to COVID have been relaxed on 1st Oct including curfew hours and limit on number of passengers in vehicles.

4

Rapid Antigen Testing (RAT) started for early detection and management of COVID-19 infections. 5,22,920 **RAT** samples tested so far.

5

Ventilators have been provided to both government and private hospitals as per the requirement

6

COVID-19 Anti-Stigma and Anti-Discrimination Campaign launched on **11 August 2020** with the support of UNDP and WHO.

SOME IMPORTANT DECISIONS

7

Government of Punjab constituted a **Group of Experts** led by **Sh. Montek Singh Ahluwalia** to develop a medium-term and longer-term **Post COVID Economic Strategy for the State**. The Group has submitted first draft of the report for further discussion.

8

Treatment Rates for Private Hospitals have been notified by the State Government basis the professional advice from from Dr. K.K. Talwar Committee.

9

Punjab among the first few states to approve **Plasma treatment** for critical COVID-19 patients in hospitals. The 1st Plasma Bank was inaugurated on **21st July 2020**. Notification for plasma therapy as free service in government & private facilities done on 1st August. Plasma banks operational in Faridkot, GMC Patiala and GMC Amritsar. A total of 113 Patients have been given Plasma therapy.

10

Punjab Government took a decision to not put stickers in front of houses of COVID positive cases in order to de-stigmatise.

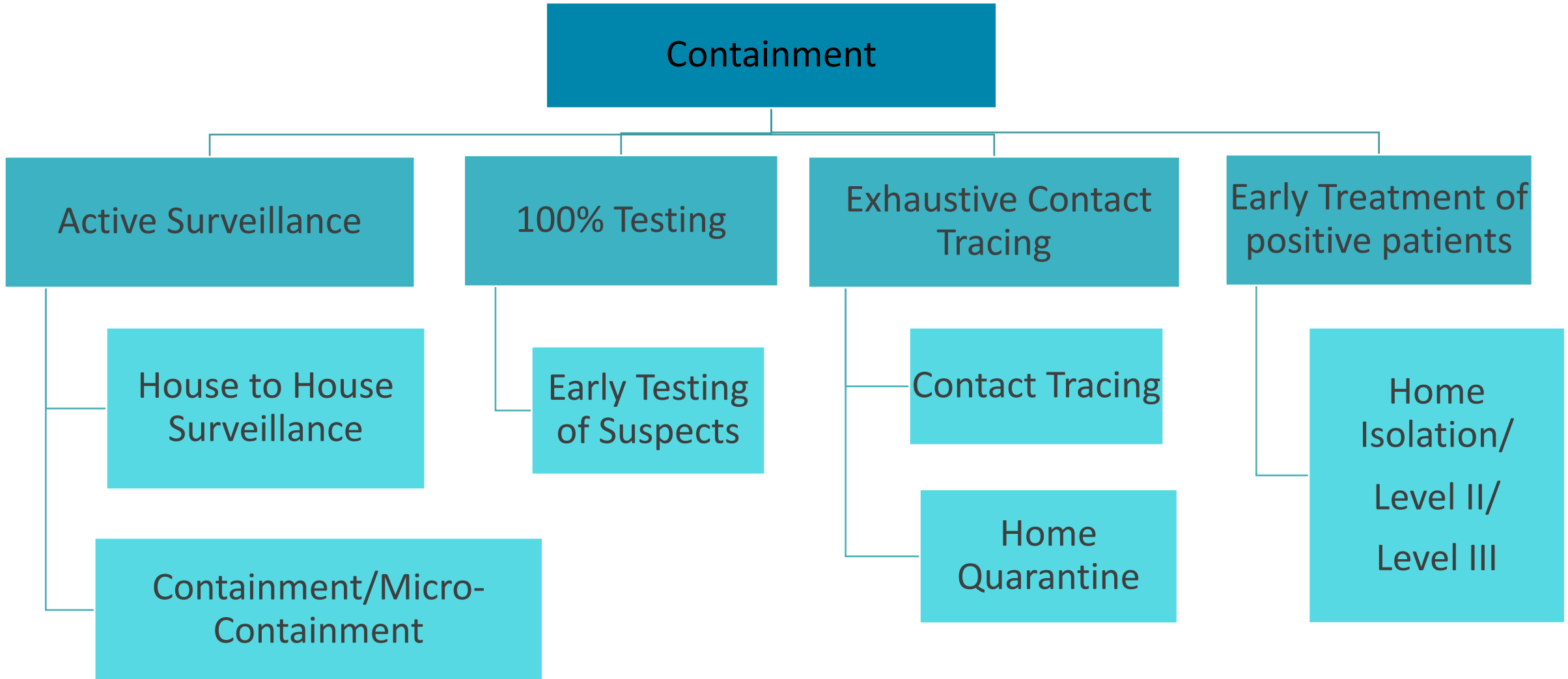

Containment Strategy



Containment & Micro-containment Zones - Activities

1 **Defining area of operation** and applying strict perimeter control.

2 **Active search of cases:** early isolation, contact listing and tracking, quarantine and follow up of contacts.

3 **Testing** all suspect cases, symptomatic contacts, asymptomatic direct and high-risk contacts of a confirmed case and ILI/SARI cases.

4 **Isolating** all suspect/confirmed cases and providing medical care.

5 **Encouraging 100% testing** of population, especially elderly and persons with co morbidities.

6 **Implementing Social distancing measures and creating awareness** on hand hygiene, respiratory etiquettes and sanitation.

House to House Survey

Punjab has initiated **surveillance for symptomatic persons** in the community to identify any person having COVID-19 symptoms at the earliest as well as to encourage elderly and persons with co-morbidities to get tested

Regular Surveillance for early detection is supervised by **Rapid Response Teams (RRTs)**. Tracking and screening of contacts of positive patients is being done

Survey in Large Outbreak Areas: 6 areas in the State with >14 cases have been declared as large outbreak areas.

House to House Survey was launched by the CM. A total of **26,522 ASHA, Anganwadi workers and volunteers** carried out data collection on a mobile app from 11th June to 31st July whereby **1,16,77,651 persons were surveyed.**

Micro Containment Zones

Any specific area within a ward/village/Lane/Residential Colony or a part of it which has **5 to 14 COVID positive cases** is designated as a Micro Containment Zone

Minimum period of Micro Containment is **10 days**. This Period can be extended one week at a time if more than one new case is found in last 7 days.

District RRTs to undertake mapping of cases and contacts along with active surveillance by ASHA workers/Community Volunteers

Perimeter Control to ensure no unchecked outward movement of population from micro-containment zones and to check influx of population into the zones

Currently, there are **34 Micro Containment Zones across 17 districts** in Punjab.

LOK SAANJHEDAARI



The '**Lok Saanjhedaari**' initiative aims to harness community bond and collective ownership in the fight against the COVID-19 pandemic. In order to ensure that everyone is involved and engaged in COVID related outreach and awareness measures, the programme calls for the formation of **a Core Committee starting in 5 districts– Amritsar, Jalandhar, Ludhiana, Patiala and SAS Nagar. 18 districts have constituted Lok Saanjhedari Committees.**

Reporting

The Core Committee submits daily quantitative and weekly qualitative reports to the State Core Committee. Supervision of the Community is done by supervisors from the ward/ zone or district as per their roster.



MISSION FATEH

Mission Fateh is the effort of the people of Punjab to defeat the pandemic in the face of overwhelming odds. It is a Mission of the people, by the people and for the people.

Punjab is creating mass awareness about:

- **Wearing masks**
- **Washing hands**
- **Maintaining social distancing**
- **Taking care of the elderly**
- **Remaining vigilant about entry of outsiders in the locality**
- **Use of COVA App to track patients of the virus and maintaining a safe distance from them**
- **Importance of Home Quarantine**
- **Symptoms of the flu and action thereafter**
- **Restrictions during Lockdown 5.0 and penalties/fines in case of violations**
- **Community mobilization to jointly fight against the pandemic**
- **Emphasizing that the threat of the virus has not diminished, rather it has become more menacing**

Activities

As part of the communication campaign, methods/platforms such as Hoardings/Posters/Announcements, Campaign Song, IVRS and SMS, Radio, CORONA Warriors, Mission Fateh Warriors, COVA App, Press notes to TV and Newspapers, and Ground Activities with the help of Sarpanches, Teachers and ASHA/Anganwadi workers are being used. Announcements are also being made through Gurudwaras and every Wednesday District Commissioners conduct a Facebook live session on the Campaign.

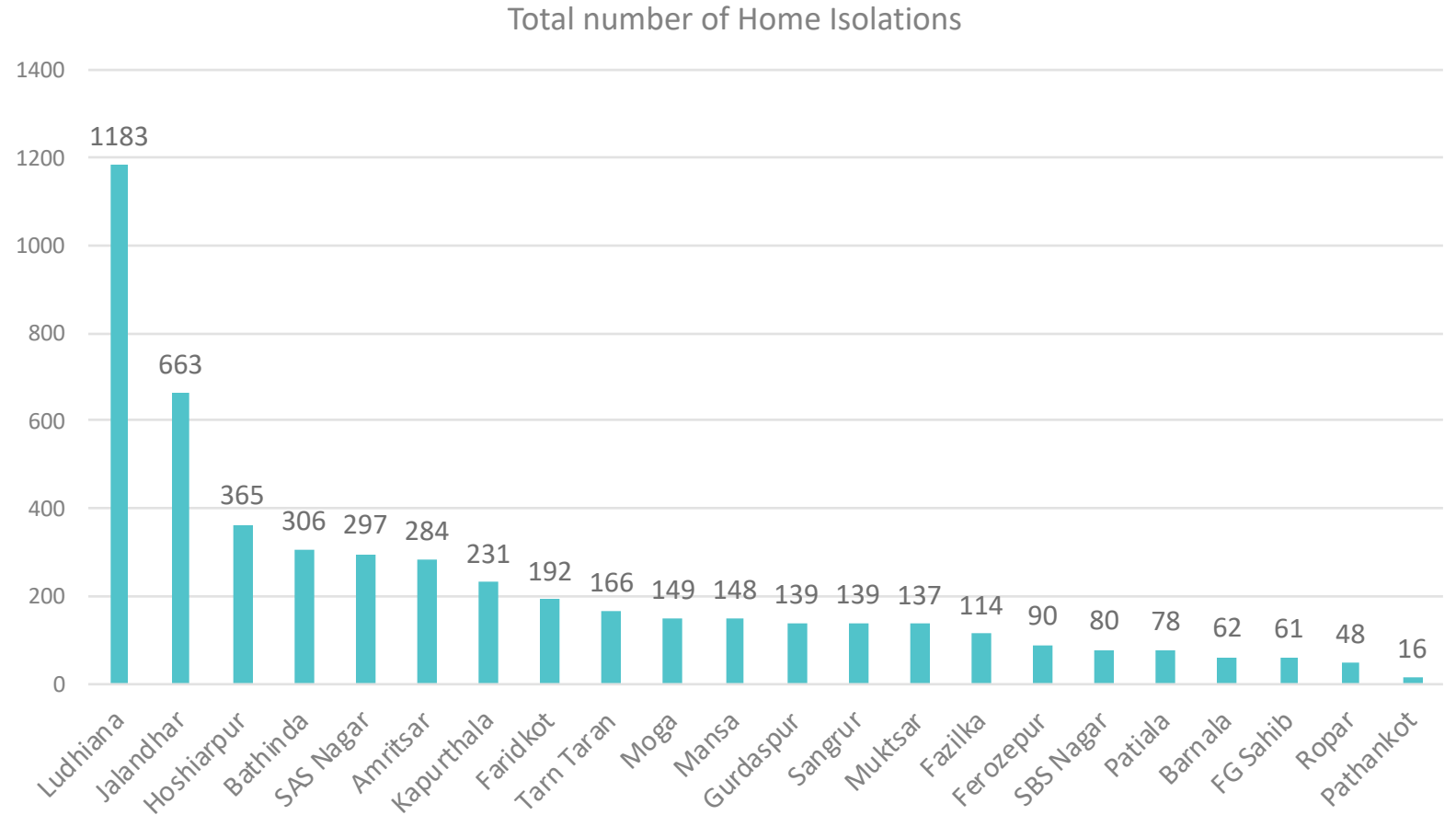

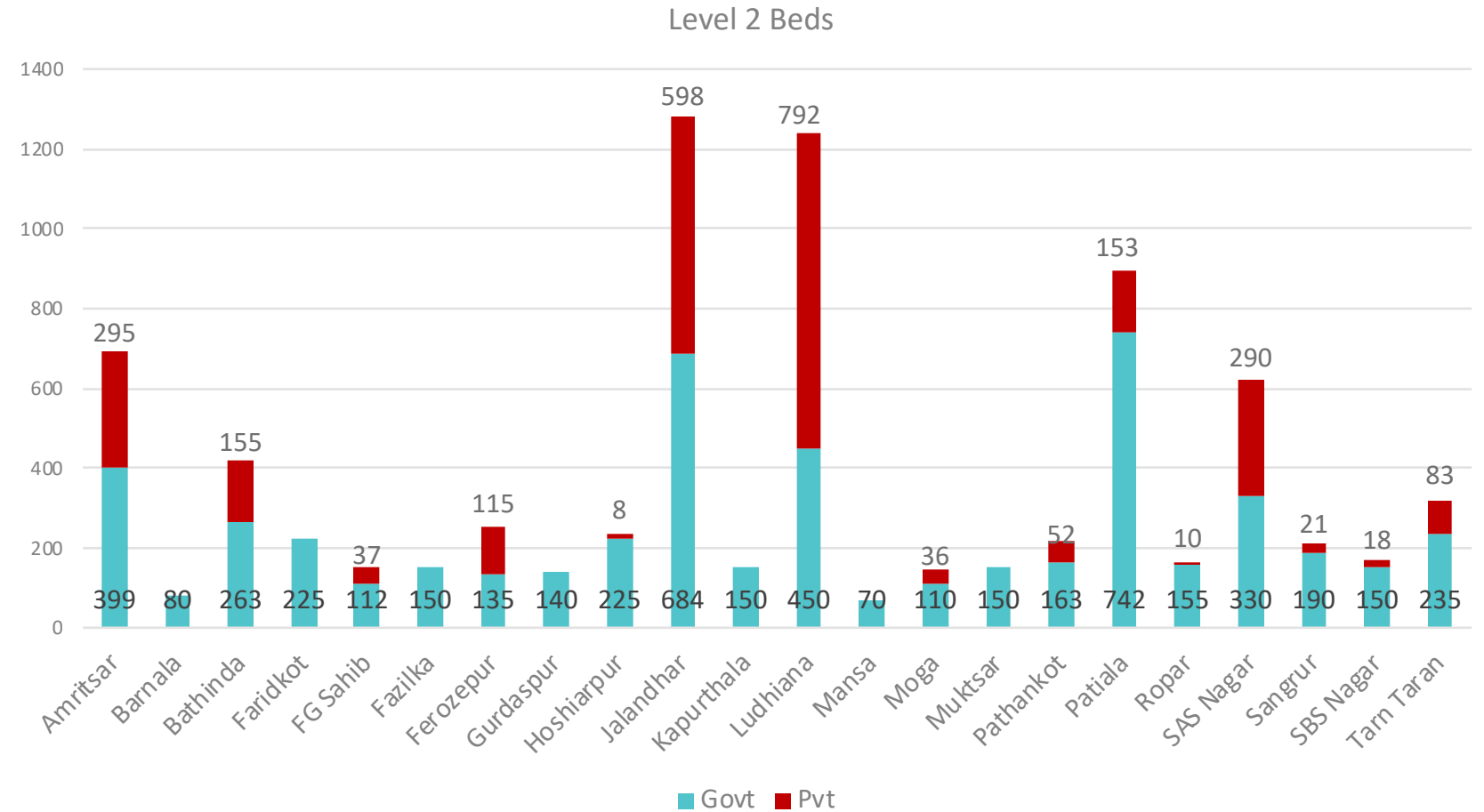
Home Isolation

Total number of Home Isolations in Punjab is **4948**. COVID Care Kits provided for free with supplies such as Pulse Oximeter, digital thermometer etc.



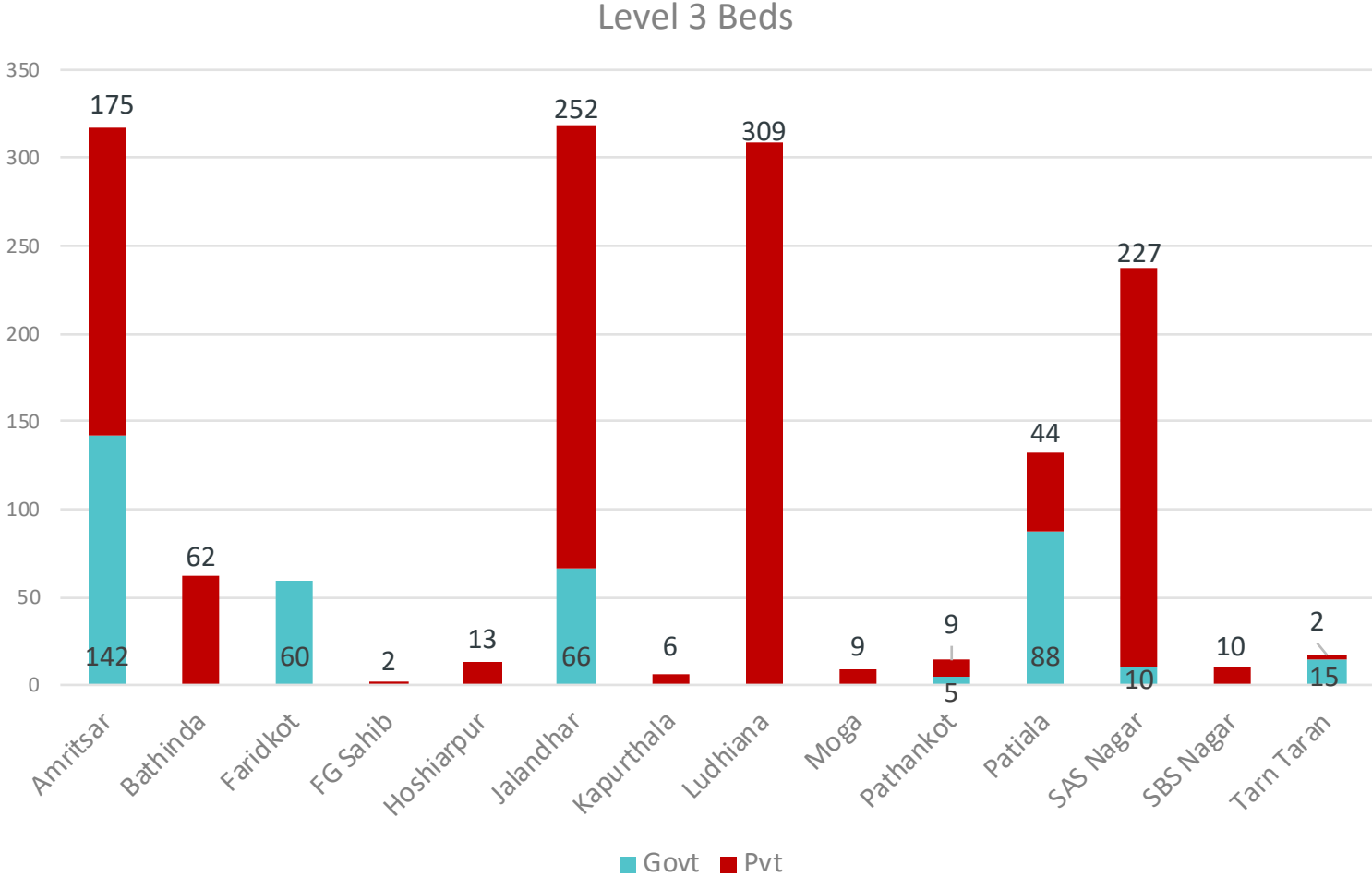
COVID Health Centres

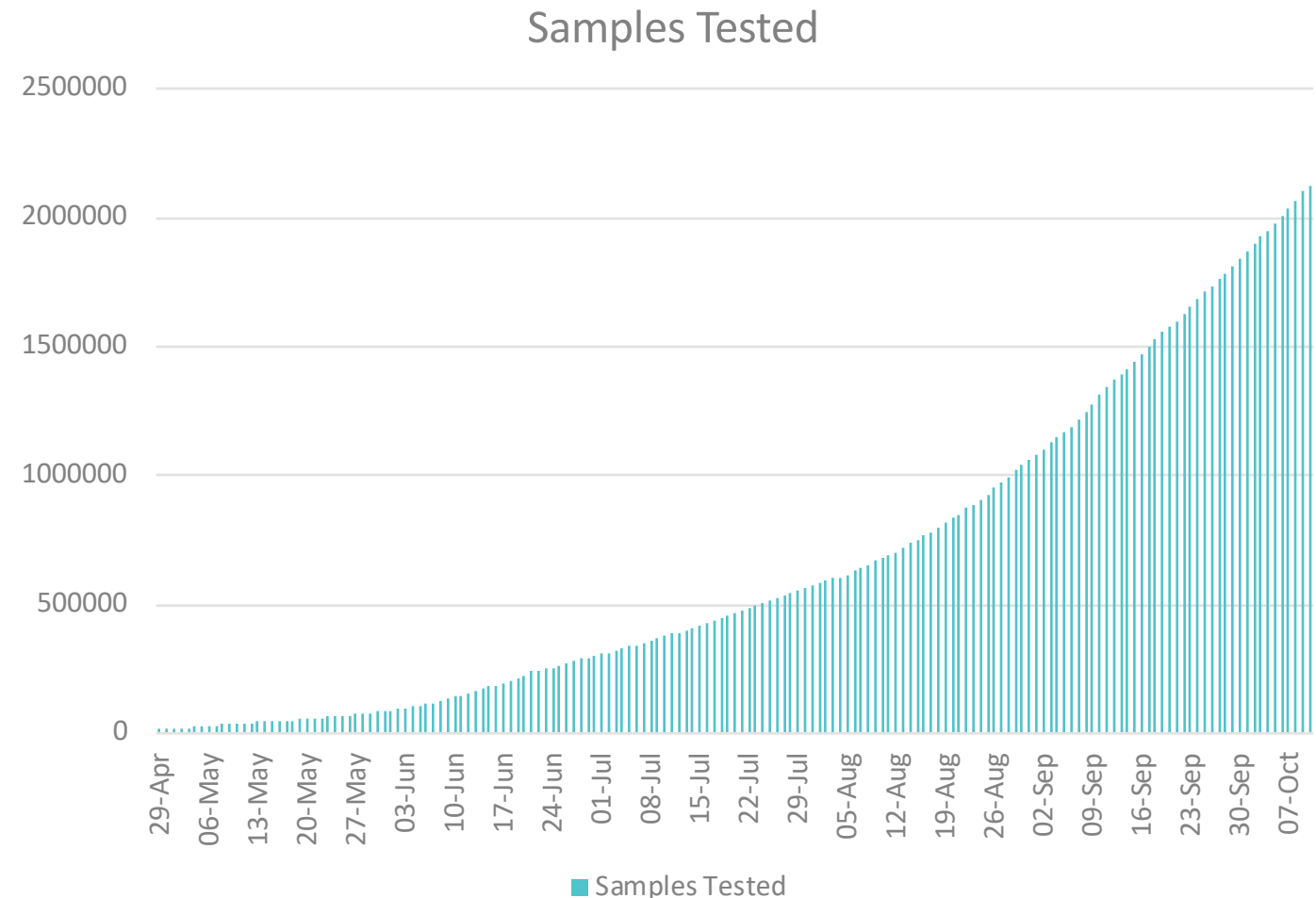

As on 10.10.2020

GMC Amritsar and GMC Patiala got **approved in March 2020** for RT-PCR COVID19 testing with a **capacity of 40 tests/day**. The **current capacity of Punjab Govt. Facilities is 19,500/day**.

From 4 tests per million population on March 16th to **70,875 tests per million population on October 10th** while the current **64,497 Indian average is tests per million population**.



Rapid Antigen Testing

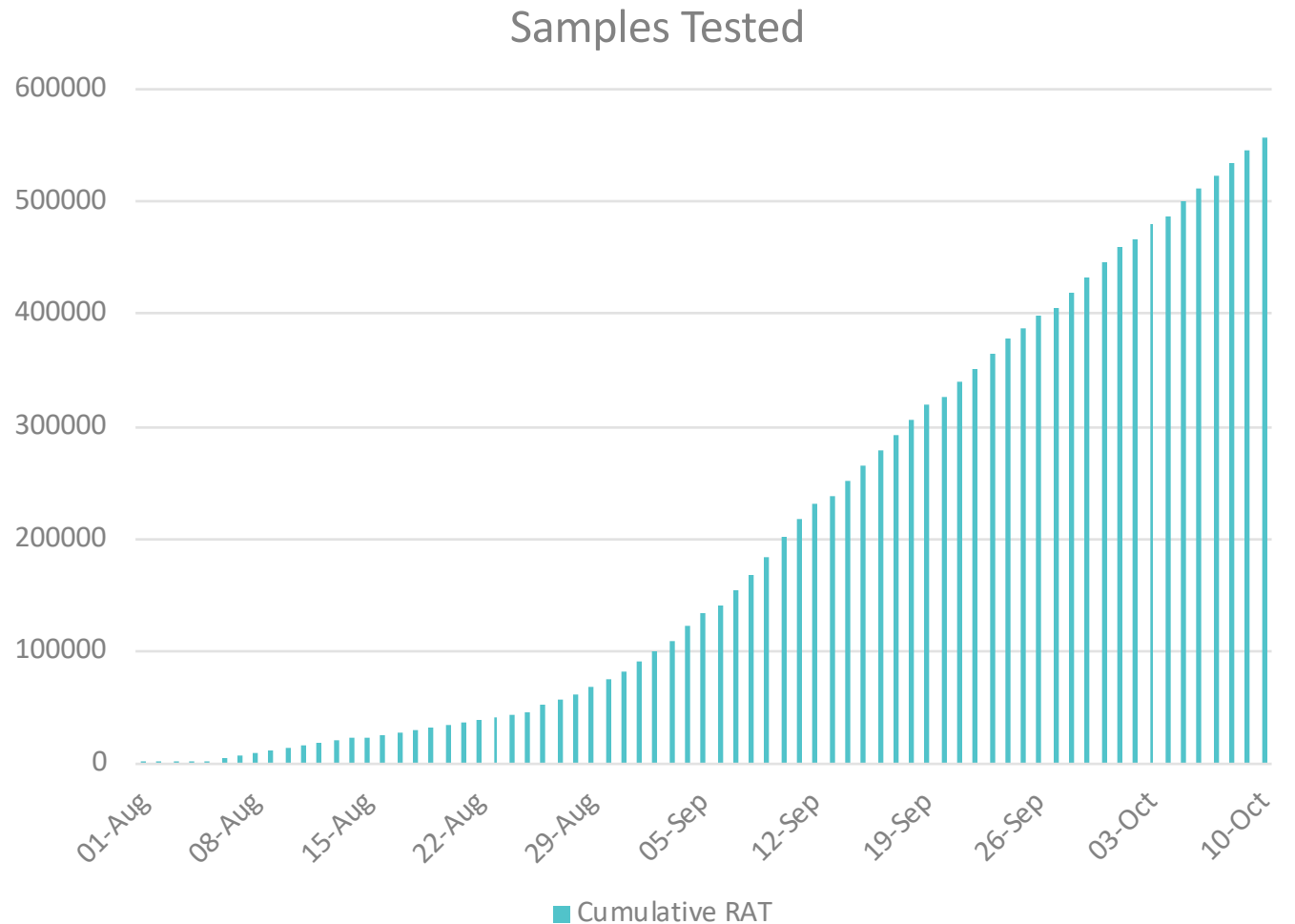
Rapid Antigen Testing shall **reduce the turnaround time** considerably and aid in quick diagnosis and management. If the result is positive, then it is taken as confirmed. However, if it is negative, then re-testing is done through TrueNat and RT-PCR.

Following categories shall be tested using Rapid Antigen Tests:

- Severe Acute Respiratory Infection (SARI) patients
- Two categories of symptomatic patients
- Three categories of asymptomatic patients

As on 10.10.2020

Punjab government started COVID-19 Rapid Antigen Testing on **10th July 2020**. 5000 kits were distributed in 8 districts - Amritsar, Jalandhar, Ludhiana, Mohali, Patiala, Kapurthala, FG Sahib and Ropar. **Rapid Antigen Testing has expanded to the entire State including at Private Hospitals/Clinics/Labs.**



TrueNat Testing

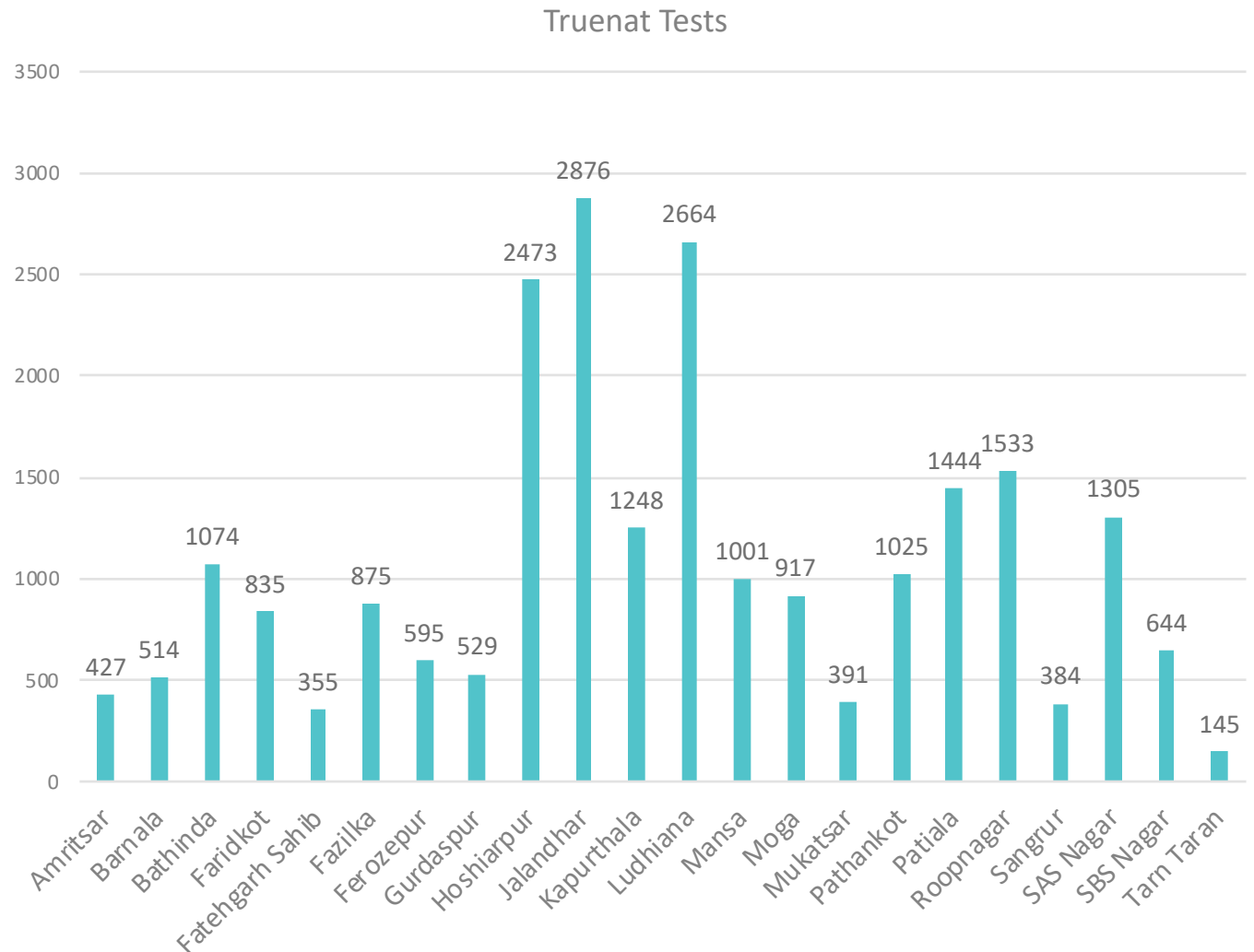
Advantage of TrueNat Testing is that the testing time is only **60 minutes**. It is being used for emergency cases of COVID 19.

Total Capacity of TrueNat testing in Punjab is **2000**.

Private hospitals can send urgent samples for testing in government facilities for **INR 1500**. 1068 such samples have been tested.

As on 12.10.2020

There are **27 TrueNat Machines** operational at District Hospitals in Punjab. Total **23,254 tests done** so far, out of which **3377 were positive**.

COVA App has **modules for sampling, patient line listing, contact tracing, containment zone, and bed management** along with **facility to check COVID-19 test result.**

2

Plasma donor registration collaborated with DGR for testing and on boarding of portal/ software through COVA App for registration of plasma volunteers.

3

Video Conferencing Solutions are being leveraged to facilitate Work-from-Home for the staff along with important webinars and VCs by the CM and other administrative staff.

4

eSanjeevani (Online OPD), a CDAC Mohali's flagship integrated telemedicine solution was implemented across the state to connect with a network of senior doctors over video conferencing.

5

Punjab has initiated a **mass awareness campaign** to educate and inform its citizens across all the channels (**Radio, TV, Social Media, Print Media**) about this pandemic.

IT Initiatives [2/2]

6

To ensure smooth operations in Mandis during the procurement weeks under COVID-19, Punjab developed a unique centralized automated, logic-based tech platform to **issue e-Passes to farmers**. All movement in the Mandis were managed online.

7

A dedicated dashboard - **corona.punjab.gov.in** to analyse the trend and pattern of cases including prediction of future hotspots to help authorities to take timely decisions.

8

A platform - **covidhelp.punjab.gov.in** for people who want to go to their home states from Punjab and those wanting to return.

9

Punjab launched **tele-medicine & tele-counselling initiatives** for general patients other than COVID-19 to get consultation from home with the empaneled doctors/counselors through video call.

10

Deployed **UiPath RPA BOT to extract district specific information** from the email, coming from more than 20 district authorities. The BOT saves the information in respective district folder.

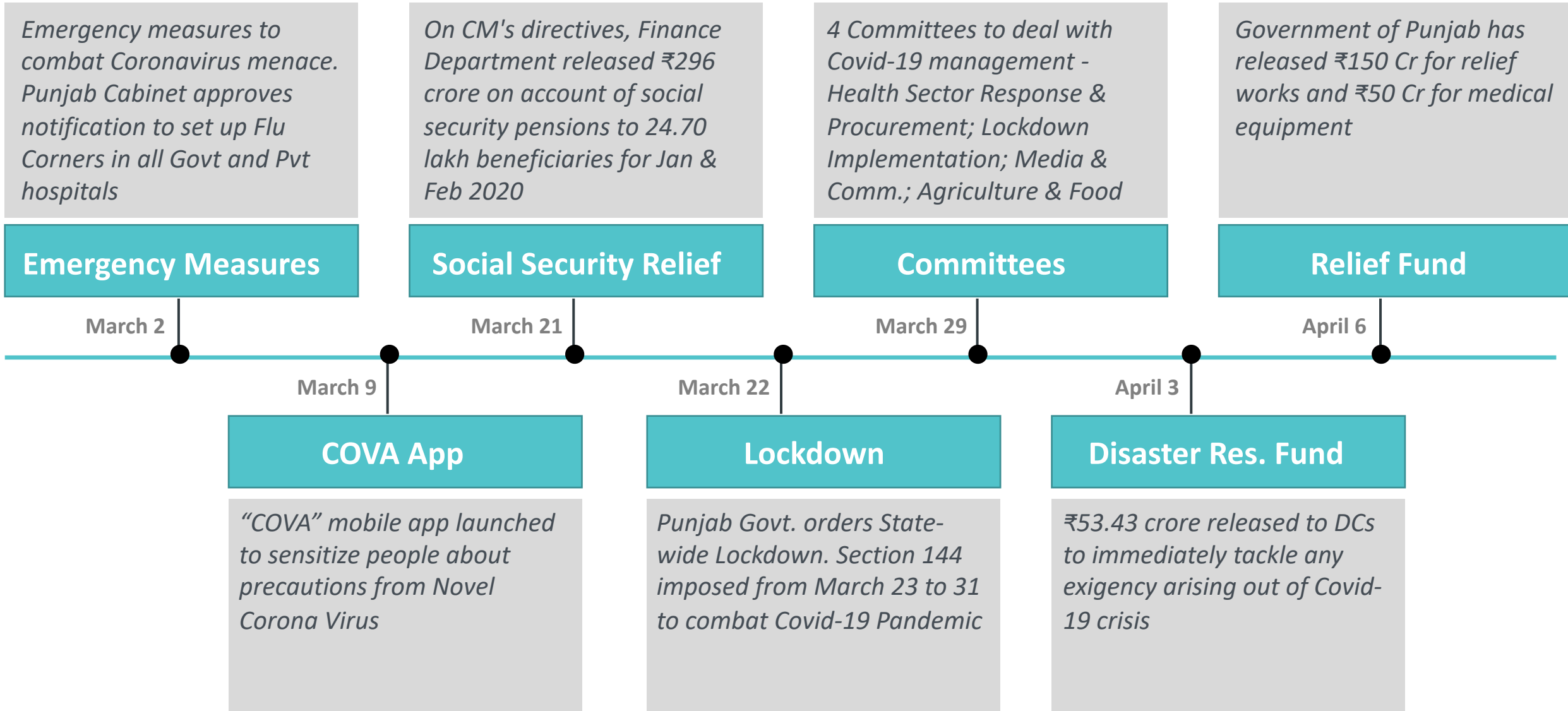

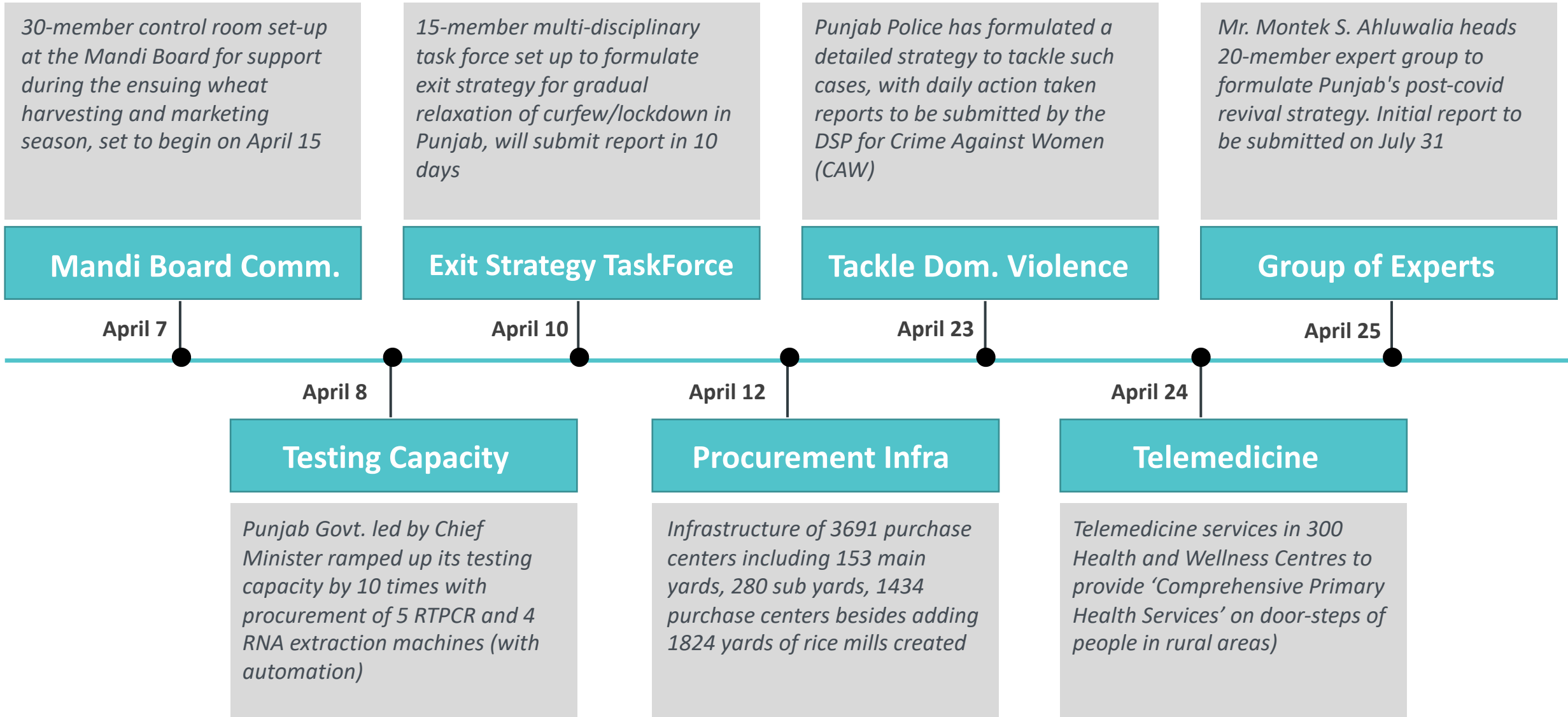

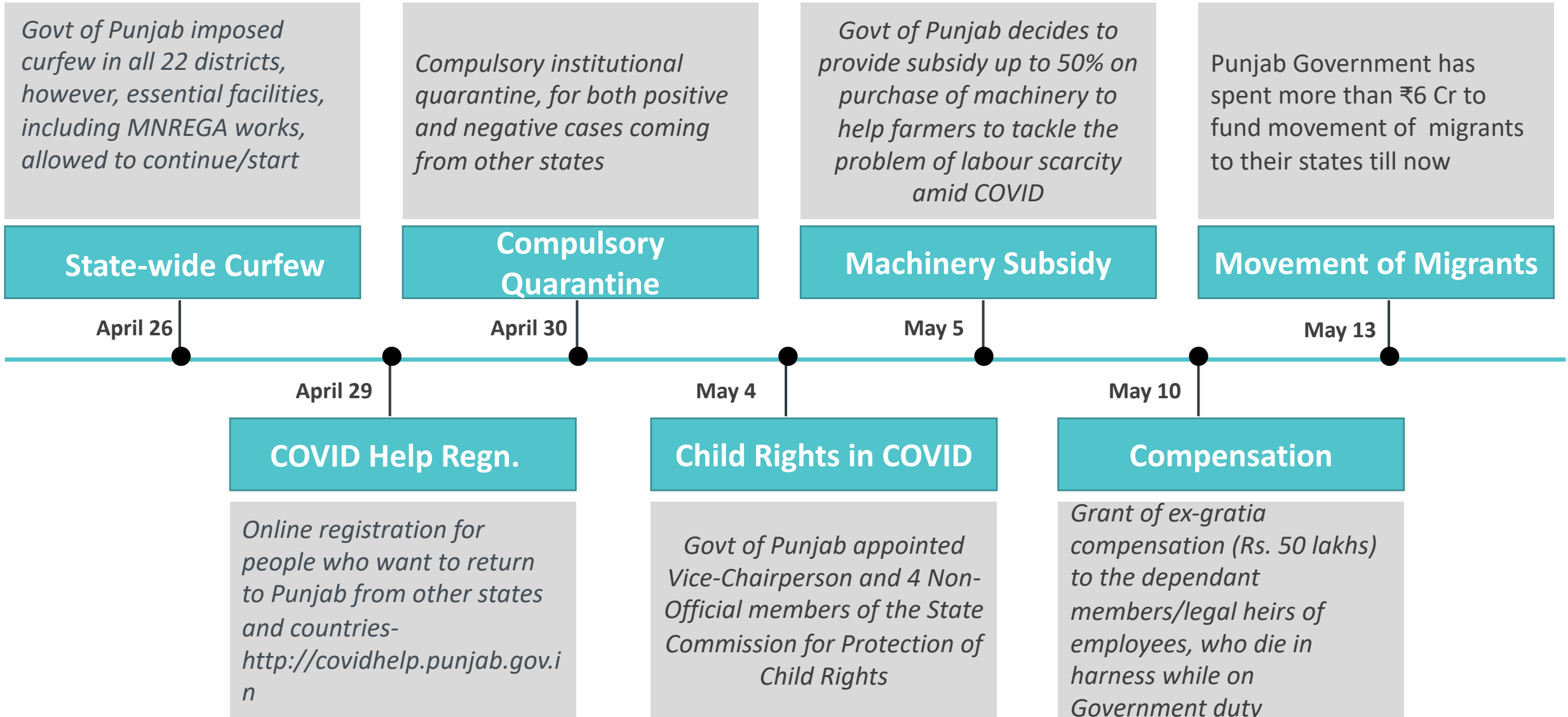
Timeline of COVID-19 Response in Punjab [1/15]



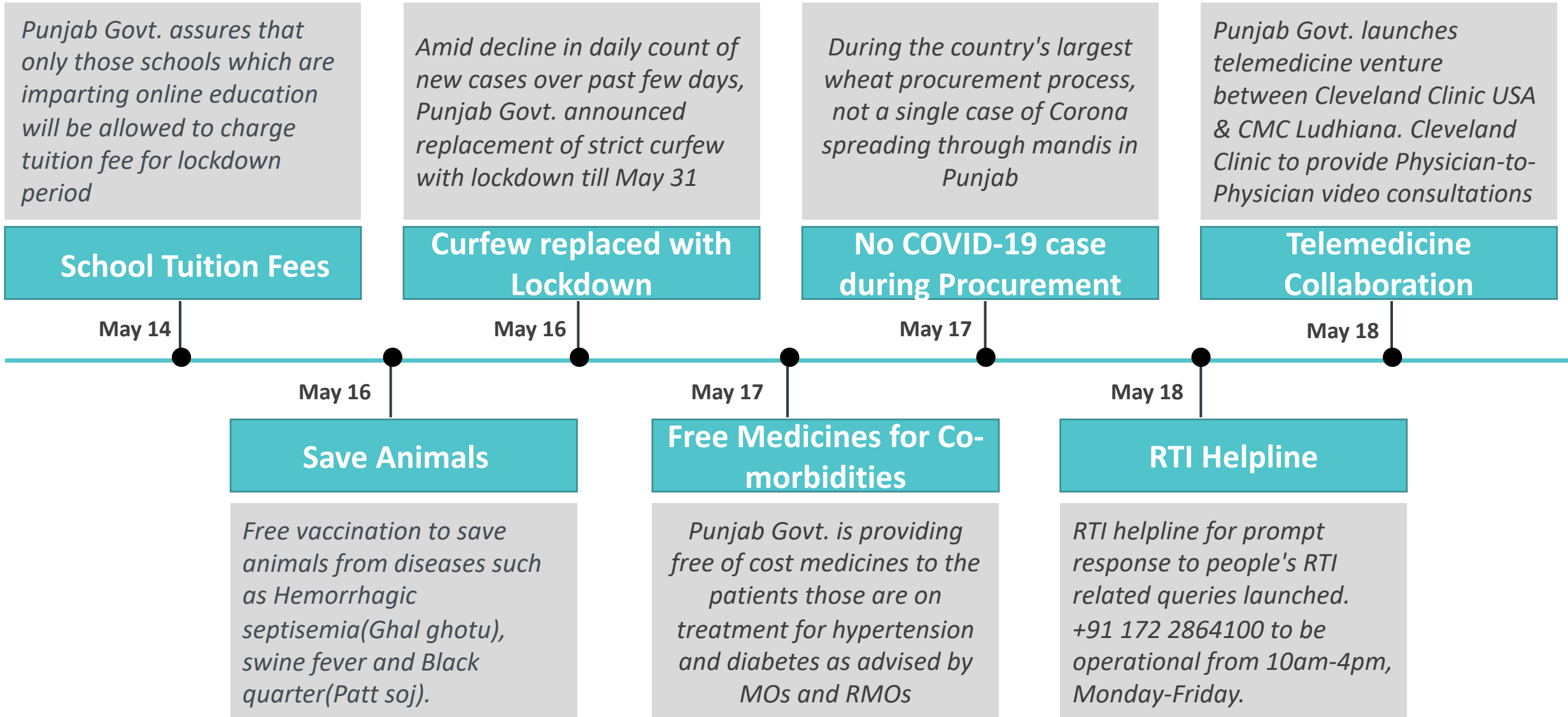
Timeline of COVID-19 Response in Punjab [2/15]



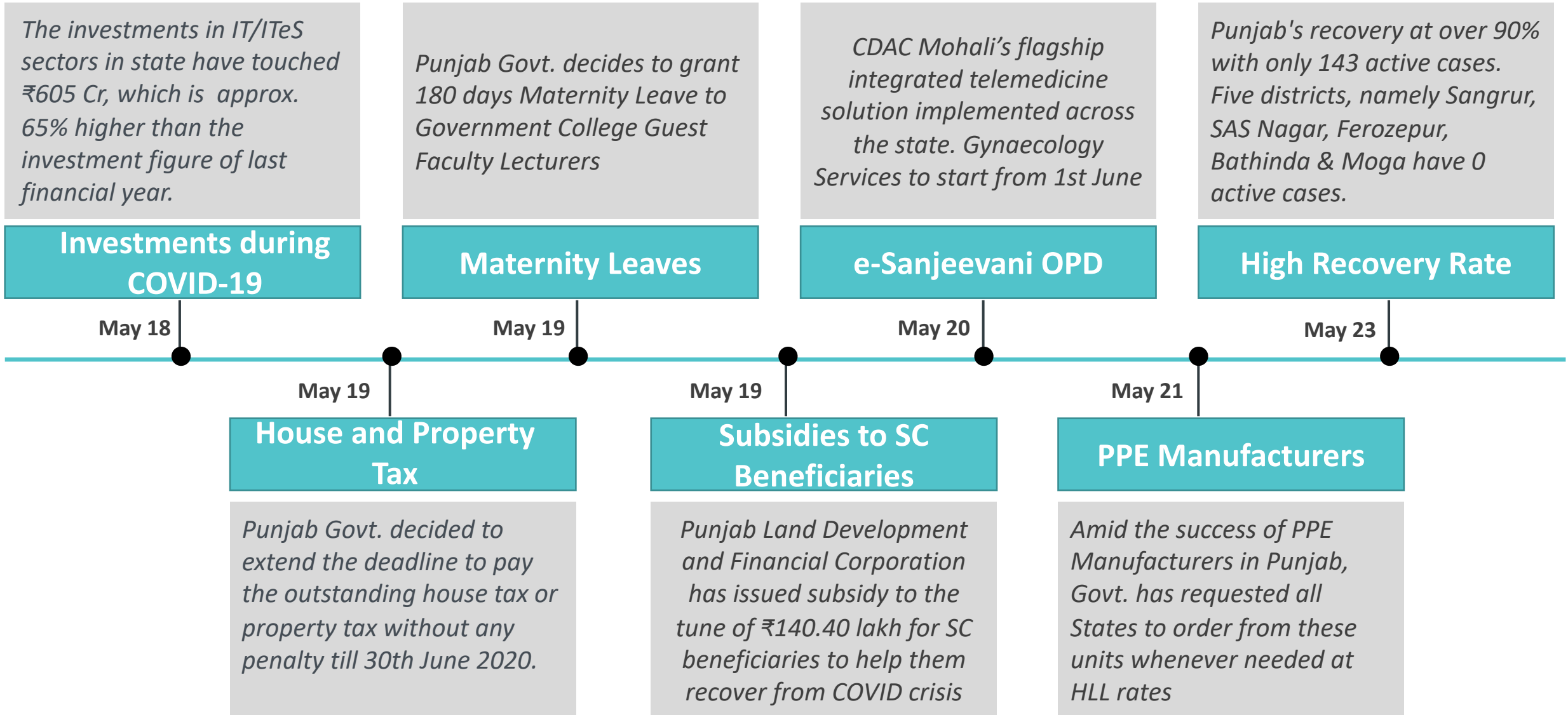
Timeline of COVID-19 Response in Punjab [3/15]



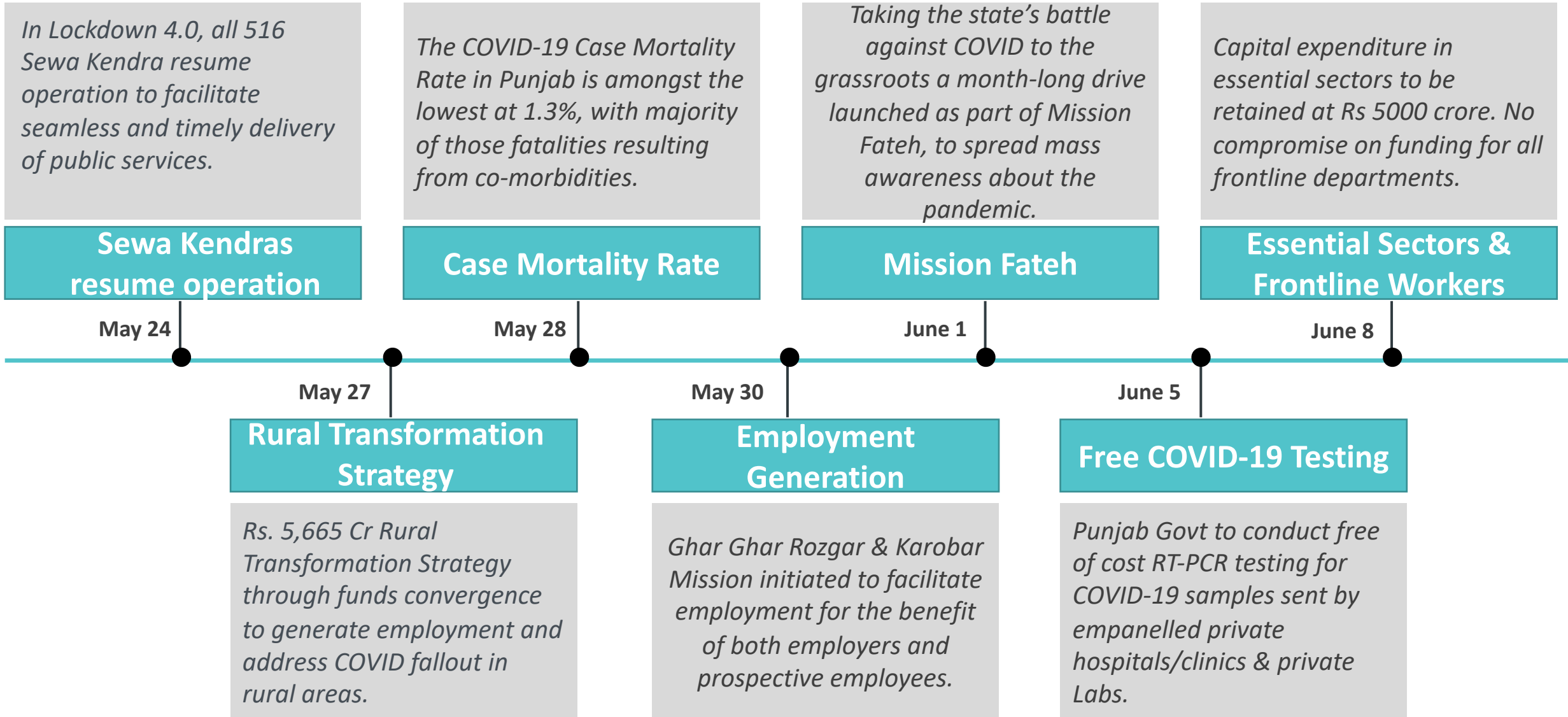
Timeline of COVID-19 Response in Punjab [4/15]



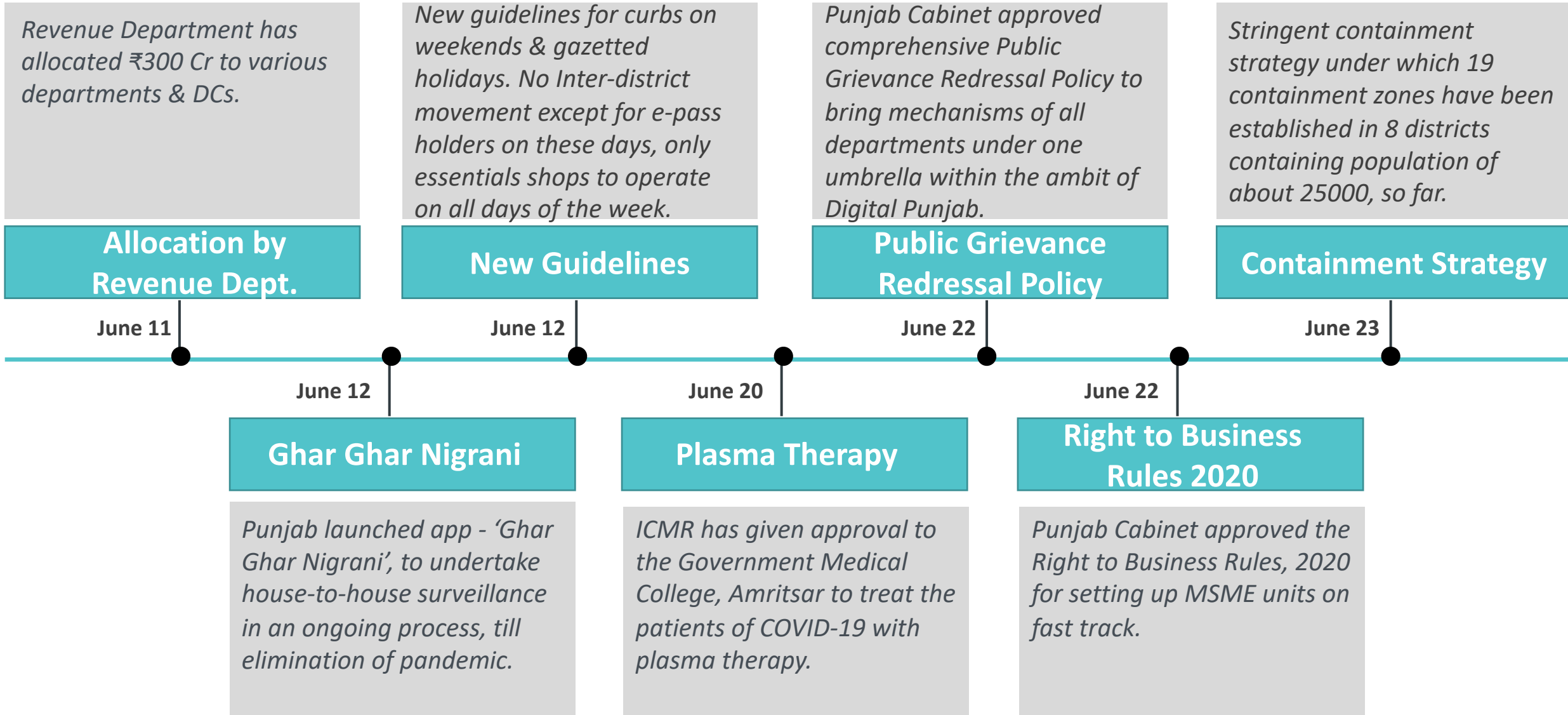
Timeline of COVID-19 Response in Punjab [5/15]



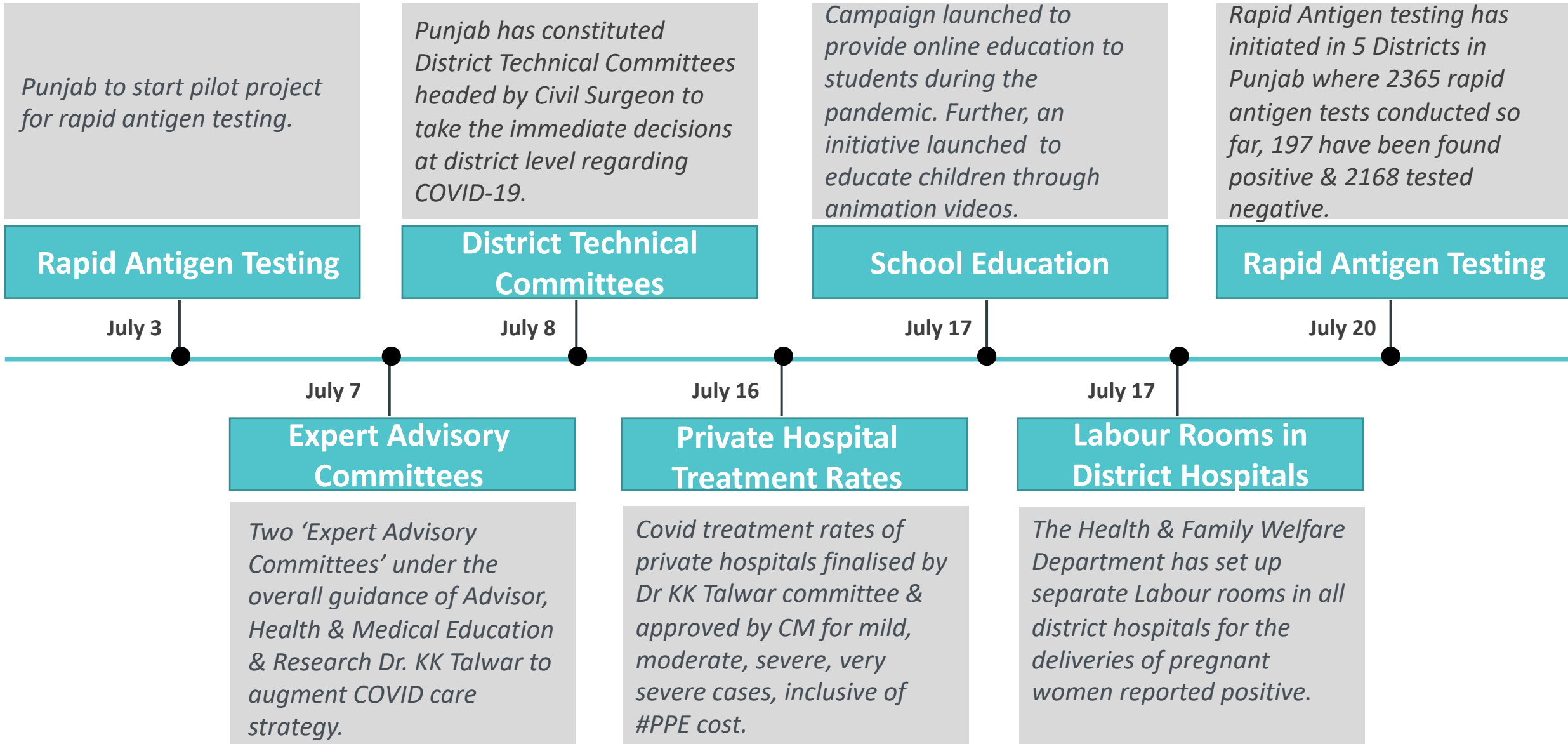
Timeline of COVID-19 Response in Punjab [6/15]



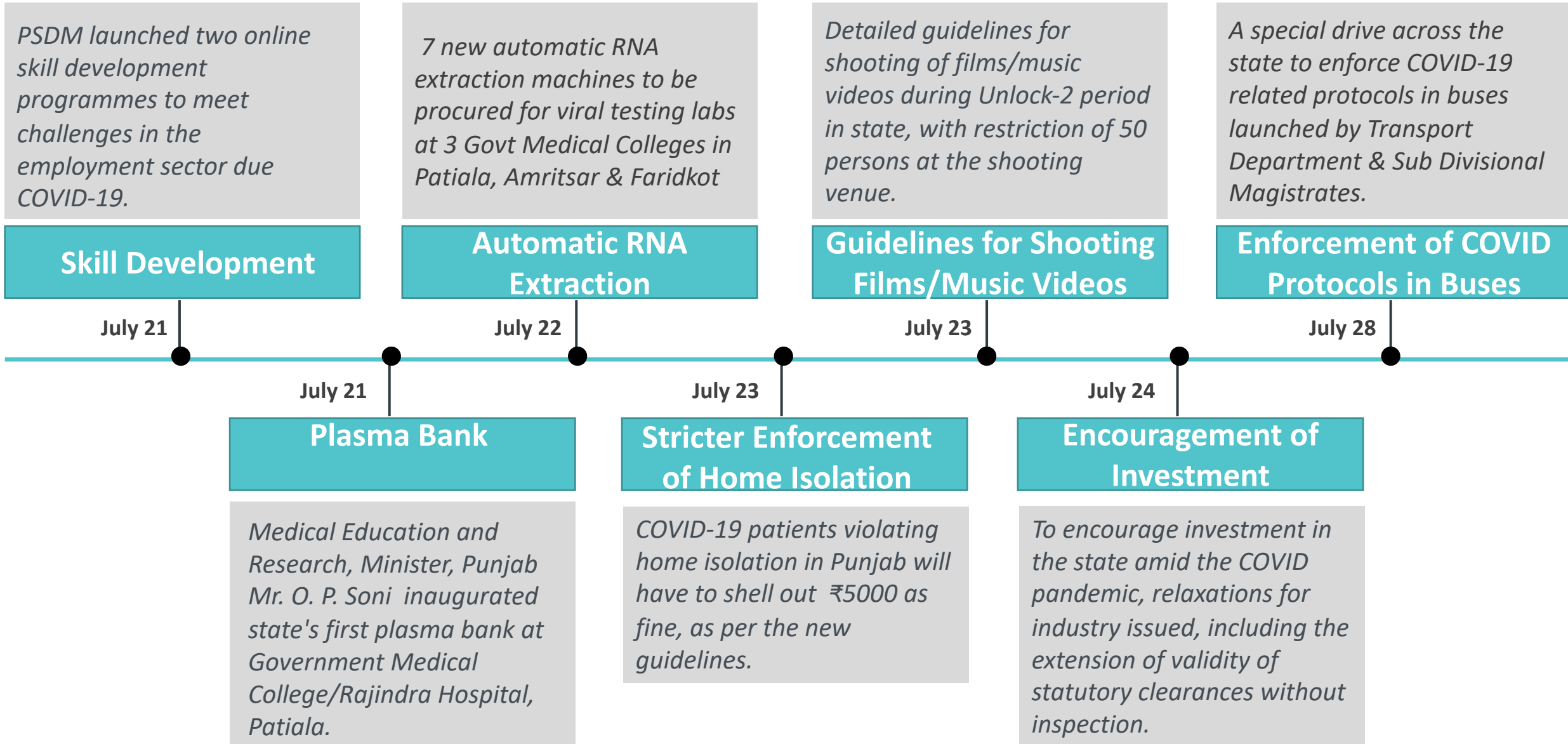
Timeline of COVID-19 Response in Punjab [7/15]



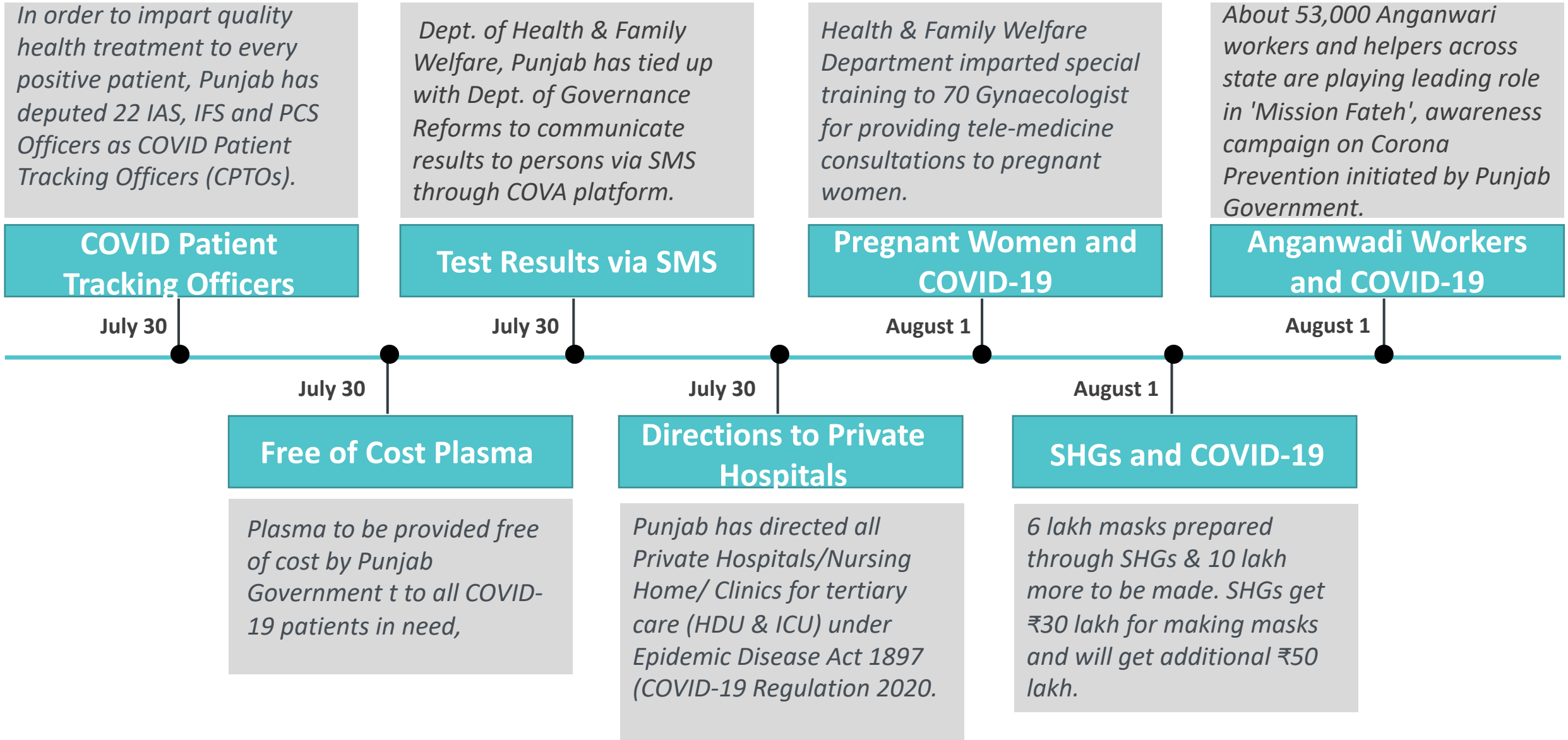
Timeline of COVID-19 Response in Punjab [8/15]



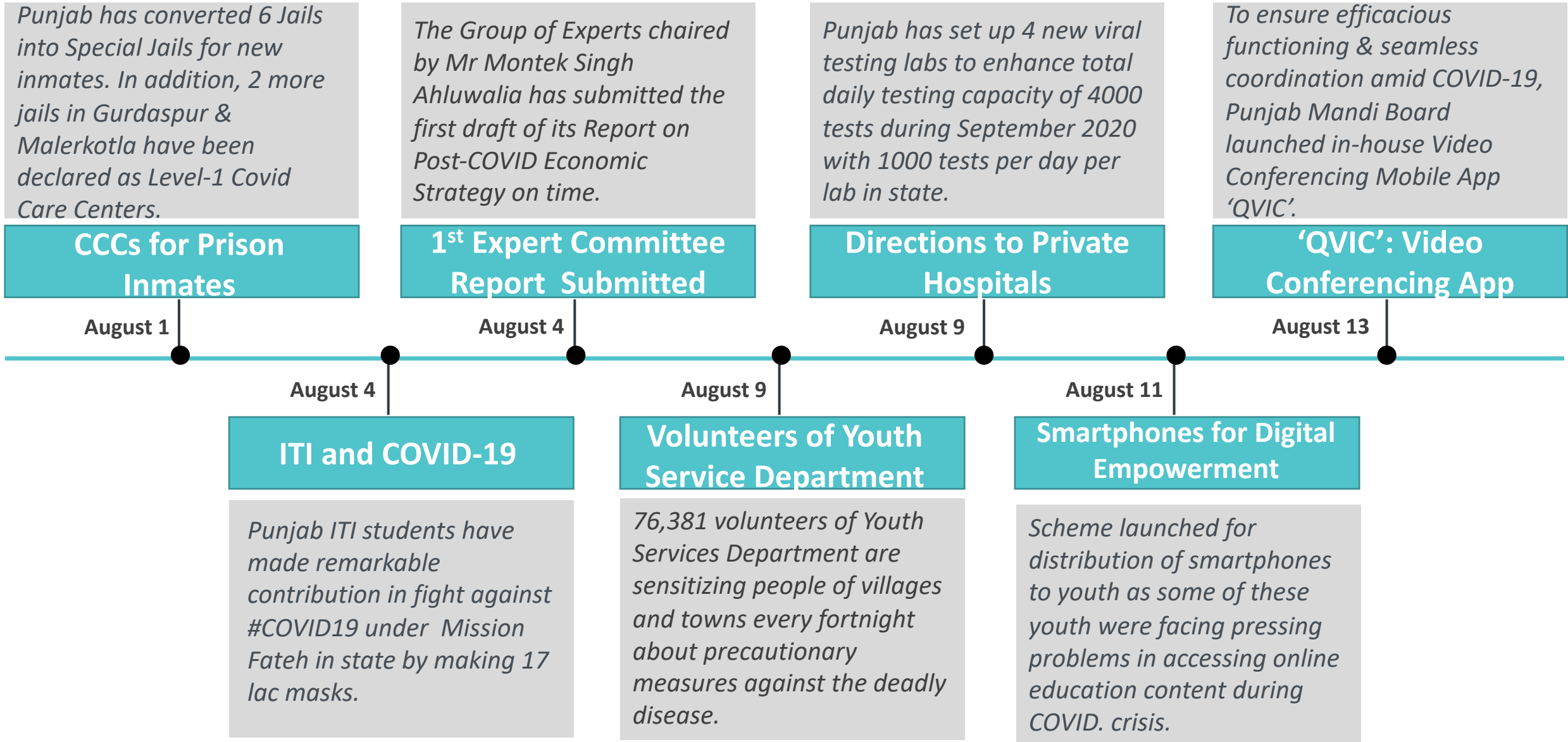
Timeline of COVID-19 Response in Punjab [9/15]



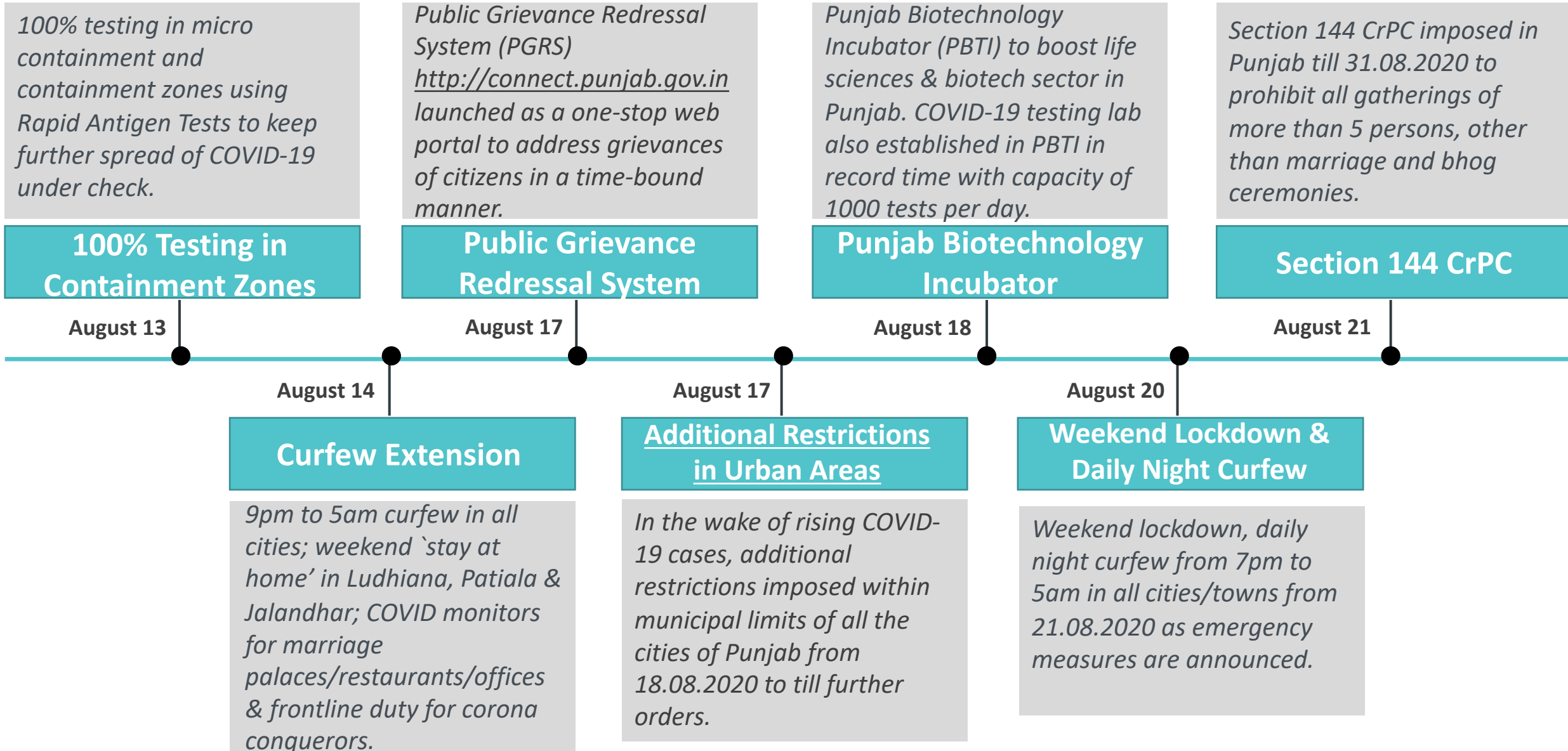
Timeline of COVID-19 Response in Punjab [10/15]
